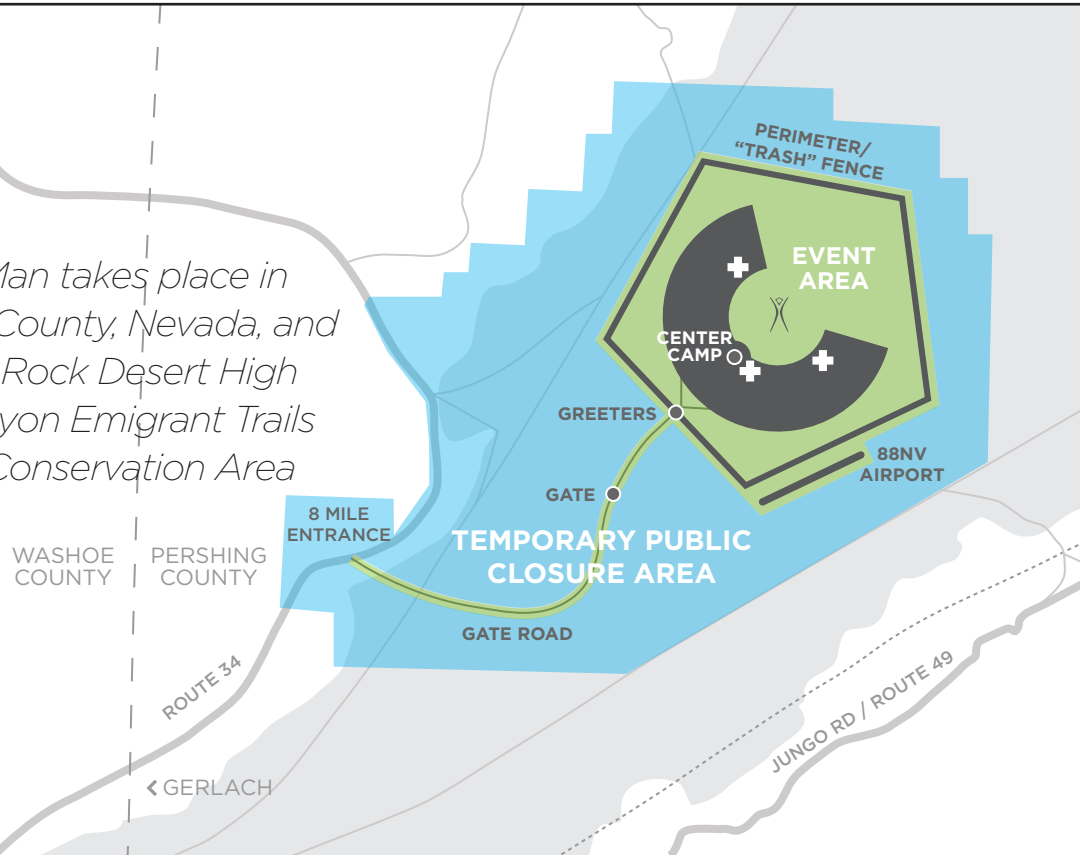


2014 BURNING MAN RULES AND REGULATIONS

Burning Man takes place in Pershing County, Nevada, and the Black Rock Desert High Rock Canyon Emigrant Trails National Conservation Area



PROHIBITED! AT ALL TIMES IN ALL PLACES

STATE & FEDERAL VIOLATIONS

1. Possession of an open container by driver of motorized vehicle
2. Providing alcohol to anyone under 21 yrs old
3. Possession or consumption of alcohol by anyone under 21 years old
4. Driving under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, or illegal drugs
5. Use and possession of illegal drugs
6. Possession of drug paraphernalia
7. Disorderly conduct
8. Any act of assault, sexual assault, battery, or theft
9. Re-entry by people who have been evicted
10. Fire on the playa surface without proper burn pad or burn container
11. Possession of fireworks
12. Possession of weapons
13. Dumping or leaking gray water, black water, or hazardous material (oil, gasoline, paint) onto the playa surface
14. Peeing or defecating on the playa surface
15. Interfering with law enforcement
16. Open and gross lewdness

YOU SHOULD KNOW...

- » Medical marijuana cards are not recognized by the federal government, and Nevada doesn't recognize medical marijuana cards from other states.
- » Possession of illegal drugs with intent to distribute is a more serious felony. Possession of large quantities may indicate intent to distribute. In Nevada you can be arrested and charged with intent to distribute even if you are gifting, and no money exchanges hands.
- » If your camp has a bar, the server must check that the person being served is over 21.
- » Nevada's blood alcohol limit is .08 for drivers 21 and over.

BURNING MAN EVENT VEHICLE RULES

DON'T GET PULLED OVER

Law Enforcement Officers in Black Rock City are sworn to uphold the law. Just like in the real world, it's up to Burning Man participants to know those laws and to follow them.

ALL VEHICLES

Speeding: Drive the speed limit at all times. During the event, the speed limit on Gate Road is 10mph and within BRC (after the Greeters station) is 5mph.

Safe driving: Drive carefully and safely. Don't drive erratically, ride on the roof of your vehicle or hang off the side. Use your turn signals in Black Rock City - watch out for bikes and pedestrians.

License: Always carry your driver's license while driving.

Parking: vehicles must not block a street or pedestrian pathway.



STOP DRIVING! During dust storms or when it rains! Paramount to public safety and maintaining playa surface conditions.

Participants can drive **donated lumber** and **burnable wood** to approved stations from 7am Sunday 8/31 to end of day Tuesday 9/2. Stations are located near the Esplanade on the open playa at 3:00, 6:00, and 9:00. NOTE: You may be directed to the Man Base with oversized wood. Drive along the Promenades ONLY!

PARTICIPANT VEHICLES

Mutant vehicles, staff cars, and other vehicles registered by Black Rock City excluded

Non-permitted driving: Once you enter Black Rock City and park your vehicle at your campsite, you cannot drive it without a BRC Department of Mutant Vehicles registration sticker.

Obscured license plates: Make sure your rear license plate isn't blocked by your bike, bike rack, dirt or anything else.

Missing or expired registration tags: Have state issued, up-to-date valid registration tags on your vehicle AND trailer.

Non-functioning lights: Make sure your license plate lights, taillights, turn signals and headlights are all working.

Registration & insurance: Always carry your vehicle registration and proof of insurance while driving.

Note that if you are stopped, the officer may choose to have a dog sniff the outside of your vehicle looking for contraband.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What is the definition an open container?

A. Any can, bottle, or vessel containing any amount of alcohol that either has no lid or the lid has been opened at any point.

Q. What constitutes possession by a driver?

A. Physically possessed or adjacent to and reachable.

Q. What is considered drug paraphernalia?

A. All equipment, products, and materials which are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance

Q. What is disorderly conduct?

A. When an individual acts with intent to recklessly cause public alarm, nuisance, jeopardy, or violence through:

- » Fighting or violent behavior
- » Using language, utterance, or gesture, or engaging in a display or act that is physically threatening or menacing, or done in a manner that is likely to inflict injury or incite an immediate breach of the peace
- » Obstructs, resists, or attempts to elude a law enforcement officer, or fails to follow their orders or directions

Q. What is a weapon?

A. Firearm, compressed gas or spring powered pistol or rifle, bow and arrow, cross bow, spear gun, hand-thrown spear, sling shot, irritant gas device, electric stunning or immobilization device, explosive device, implement designed to expel a projectile, switch-blade knife, or knife > 10' blade (does not apply to cooking)

Q. What is MOOP?

A. MOOP is "Matter Out Of Place," a term for anything, including trash, that is not originally ON or OF the Black Rock Desert. Burning Man is the largest Leave No Trace event in the world, and Black Rock City is recognized by BLM for setting high standards by which other events are measured. This wouldn't be possible without the concerted efforts of every last participant and BRC's Playa Restoration Team, working tirelessly for weeks after the event to return the playa to its pristine condition.
